## How to Prepare Glass for Recycling

RCSW only accepts glass that contained food or beverage.

- Please rinse your glass thoroughly.
- Remove all caps and lids. The steel lids can be recycled with the tin cans.
- Throw away the plastic lids.
- Labels do not have to be removed.
- Sort according to color and do not to break the glass!



## How to Dispose of Broken Glass

1. Take proper precautions: Wear work gloves and thick-soled shoes when cleaning up broken glass.
2. Place the bigger pieces in a large trash bag.
3. Vacuum up smaller pieces.
4. Blot the area with a soft piece of bread. Throw out the bread.
5. Wipe down the area with a damp paper towel.
6. Place the trash bag in a cardboard box.
7. Put the container out with the normal trash.
